The strategy is based on the *Vision Zero* initiative commenced in Sweden. This is an imperative that no loss of life or injury from road accidents is acceptable, and that governments need to do everything possible to reduce the road toll. The Stonnington Council has adopted the Vision Zero commitment as their objective.
